LESSON FROM THE INCIDENT OF MUS السلام OF MUS

Musa عليه السلام teaches us that death is something we need to always keep preparing ourselves for because there is no one from amongst us that can say that we are ready to die.

HADITH

Nabi صلي الله عليه و سلم said " Frequently remember the destroyer of pleasures" meaning death.

HADITH

عَنْ عَائِشَةَ، أَنَّ رَسُولَ اللَّهِ _ صلى الله عليه وسلم _ قَالَ : " مَنْ أَحَبَّ لِقَاءَ اللَّهِ لِقَاءَهُ "

"Whoever loves to meet Allah, Allah loves to meet him and whoever hates to meet Allah, Allah hates to meet him."

EXPLANATION

Everyone has a natural hesitancy to death. This hadeeth refers to when when a person is in the moments of death and he is given the glad tidings of the pleasure of Allah, at that moment he will want to meet Allah and Allah will want to meet him. But if he is sinful, disobedient, he will be given the glad tidings of the displeasure of Allah and he will hate to meet Allah, then Allah will hate to meet him as well.
