He Is the Best Disposer of affairs' when he was thrown into the fire and it was said by Muḥammad ﷺ when they said: 'A great army is gathering against you, therefore, fear them', but it only increased their faith and they said: 'Allah is Sufficient for us and He is the Best Disposer of affairs.'' Sayyidunā Anas reported: "Whenever a matter would distress him, the Messenger of Alläh would say: [the above]." (Tirmidhī #3524)




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لَا حَوْلَ وَلَا قُوَّةَ إِلَّا بِاللهِ الْعَلِيِّ الْعَظِيْمِ.

Laa ḥawla walaa quwwata illaa billaahil ʿaliyyil ʿadheem

There is no strength nor power except through Allāh, Most High, Most Mighty.

Sayyidunā Abū Hurayrah & reported that the Messenger of Allāh & said: "Saying [the above] is a cure for ninety-nine sicknesses, the most minor being sorrow/depression." (Mustadrak Hākim #2009)



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لَا إِلٰهَ إِلَّا أَنْتَ سُبْحَانَكَ إِنِّي كُنْتُ مِنَ الظَّالِمِيْنَ.

Laa ilaaha illaa Anta subḥaanaka in-nee kuntu minadh dhaalimeen None has the right to be worshiped except You, Pure are You. Indeed, I was among the wrongdoers. {21:87} Ibrāhīm ibn Muḥammad ibn Sa'd narrated from his father, from Sa'd that the Messenger of Allāh ﷺ said: "The supplication of Dhun-Nūn (Yūnus ³⁴⁴) when he supplicated, while in the belly of the whale was: [the above]. So verily, no Muslim man ever supplicates with it for anything, except Allāh responds to him."

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لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللهُ الْعَظِيْمُ الْحَلِيْمُ، لَا إِلَٰهَ إِلَّا اللهُ رَبُّ الْعَرْشِ الْعَظِيْمِ، لَا إِلَٰهَ إِلَّا اللهُ رَبُّ السَّمَاوَاتِ وَرَبُّ الْأَرْضِ رَبُّ الْعَرْشِ الْكَرِيمِ.

Laa ilaaha illallāhul 'adheemul haleem, laa ilaaha illallāhu rabbul 'arshil 'adheem, laa ilaaha illallāhu rabbus samaawaati wa rabbul ardi rabbul 'arshil kareem.

There is no god but Allāh, the August, the Enduring. There is no god but Allāh, the Lord of the Great Throne. There is no god but Allāh, the Lord of the Heavens and Earth and the Lord of the Throne of Honour. Sayyidunā 'Abdullāh ibn 'Abbās reported that when the Messenger of Allah was distressed, he would recite [the above]. (Muslim#2730)

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اَللَّهُمَّ رَحْمَتَكَ أَرْجُوْ، فَلَا تَكِلْنِيْ إِلَى نَفْسِيْ طَرْفَةَ عَيْن، وَأَصْلِحْ لِيْ شَأْنِيْ كُلَّهُ، لَا إِلَٰهَ إِلَّا أَنْتَ.

'Allāhumma raḥmataka arjoo, fa laa takilnee ilaa nafsee ṭarfata 'ayn, wa aṣliḥ lee sha'nee kullah, laa ilaaha illaa ant' O Allāh, it is Your mercy that I hope for, so do not leave me in charge of my affairs even for a blink of an eye and rectify for me all my affairs. None has the right to be worshiped except You.

Sayyidunā Abī Bakrah reported that the Messenger of Allāh se said: "The du'ā' of a distressed person is [the above]." (Abū Dāwūd #5090)



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اللَّهُمَّ إِنَّىٰ أَعُوْذُ بِكَ مِنَ الْهَمِّ وَالْحُزْنِ، وَأَعُوْذُ بِكَ مِنَ الْعَجْزِ وَالْكَسَل، وَأَعُوْذُ بِكَ مِنَ الْجُبْنِ وَالْبُخْلِ، وَأَعُوْذُ بِكَ مِنْ غَلَبَةِ الدَّيْنِ وَقَهْرِ الرِّجَال.

Allāhumma in-nee a-'udhu bika minal-hammi wal-huzn, wa a-'udhu bika minal-'ajzi wal-kasal, wa a-'udhu bika minal-jubni wal-bukhl, wa a-'udhu bika min ghalabatid-dayni wa qahrir-rijaal

O Allāh, I seek refuge in You from worry and grief, I seek refuge in You from impotence and laziness, I seek refuge in You from cowardice and miserliness, and I seek refuge in You from overpowering debt and the subduing of men.

Sayyidunā Abū Saʿīd Khudrī 🍪 narrated that: "One day, the Messenger of Allāh 🚟 entered the Masjid, and saw a person from the Anşār by the name of Abū 'Umāmah . He said: 'O Abū 'Umāmah, why is it that I see you sitting in the masjid even though this is not the time for prayer?" He said: '(Because of) misery that has overtaken me, and debts, O Messenger of Allāh.' He said: 'Should I not teach you phrases that, if you say them, Allāh will remove your misery and repay your debt?' He said: 'Yes, O Messenger of Allāh.' So, he said: 'Say in the morning and evening (the above du'ā').' He said: 'So I did that, and Allāh removed my sorrows, and fulfilled my debts." (Abū Dāwūd #1555)
